
We have implemented gender-transformative projects in cities across five continents. Our 30 city projects have resulted in reconstructed and regenerated public spaces in Palestine, Lebanon, India, Nepal, Thailand, Peru, Jamaica, Kenya, Uganda, Mozambique, South Africa, Sweden, Italy, Germany and Greece.

Aligned with United Nations Habitat Assembly Resolutions 'Achieving gender equality to support inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable cities and human settlements', and 'Localization of the Sustainable Development Goals', Women-Led Cities is identified among the High Impact Initiatives bringing SDG solutions to scale. The joint UN programme will make use of Her City Toolbox to support women's economic, political and territorial empowerment. Until 2030, the ambition is for 100 women-led cities to catalyse investment of 1 billion USD.

REFUGEE - HOST COMMUNITY INTEGRATION

Location: Kakuma Refugee Camp, Kalobeyei Town, Turkana, Kenya

Partner: UN-Habitat, UNHCR, Kounkuey Design Initiative, Japan

Time: April 2021 – December 2023

The “Ensuring accessibility and a strengthened conflict resolution strategy for refugee host community integration in Kalobeyei, Turkana County” programme supports inclusive accessibility to public spaces through a series of engagements with host and refugee members. Through engaging women, children, men, youth, and people with disabilities, accessible, inclusive, safe, and comfortable public spaces were co-created. The community-driven approach emphasised the importance of children’s play and recreation, spaces for women to meet and conduct business, shaded zones for respite from the extreme heat, and multifunctional sports and games areas. 100 multi-stakeholders contributed to 1 site, potentially impacting 5,000 daily lives.



Location: Dunga road and Dundori road, Industrial Area, Nairobi County, Kenya

Partners: GoDown Arts Centre, UN-Habitat, Global Utmaning, Planning Systems, White Architects

Time: June 2021 – December 2023

'Her City - Her Streets' by the GoDown Arts Centre aims to improve the Dunga and Dundori streets around the upcoming New GoDown Cultural Arts Complex in Nairobi together with UN-Habitat and partners. It aims at more accessible streets and inclusive public spaces, accommodating a diversity of shared commercial, social, and cultural activities and inviting all Nairobians to become a part of the new cultural hub. 100 multi-stakeholders contributed to 1 site, potentially impacting 5,000 daily lives.



Time: June 2020 – December 2022

In Diepsloot township, the Johannesburg Development Agency, UN-Habitat and partners initiated the "Indlela Yabafazi – Women's Way" project. It aimed at creating safe routes, improving mobility and connecting safe public spaces in the informal settlement. Through participatory planning and community engagement, 100 multi-stakeholders made proposals and developed a tactical urbanism intervention, for a redesigned site with a focus on accessibility, affordability, safety potentially impacting 5,000 daily lives.

GENDER-SENSITIVE SOLUTIONS FOR IDPs

Location: Mahate neighbourhood, Pemba, Cabo Delgado Province, Mozambique

Partner: UN-Habitat, International Organization for Migration, High Commission of Canada in Mozambique

Time: July 2022 - ongoing

In Her City Pemba, UN-Habitat’s country office in Mozambique is fostering inclusion and cohesion among internally displaced people (IDPs) and host communities in the Mahate neighborhood in Pemba. The upcoming Mahate Action Plan will transform this neighborhood, with a special focus on women and girls fostering locally-owned infrastructure, by empowering local communities, IDPs and host communities. 100 stakeholders contributed to 1 site, set to impact 5,000 people.





HADE and Dream-town create spaces with and for women and girls using Her City Toolbox. They co-designed a new space for women in Kamwanyi including community spaces, safe green rooftops, market-places and improving livelihood and economic opportunities, combining productive social meeting spaces and income generating opportunities for women. 100 multi-stakeholders contributed to 1 multi-function site, impacting 5,000 daily lives.

Key message 1

Gender is acknowledged as a part of all major global agendas and agreements and is a main pillar of human rights, hence a duty to be integrated in all activities, every time, everywhere, without any exception. However, gender mainstreaming is still highly overlooked in practice.



Key message 2

There are a range of actions that urban actors can take to implement gender-sensitive cities. Simply integrating and mainstreaming it into everyday work, it is not difficult nor requires considerable resources. It is above all a change in mindset among professionals.



SDG 10: Reduce inequality within and among countries

Target 10.3 Ensure equal opportunity and reduce inequalities of outcome, including by eliminating discriminatory laws, policies and practices and promoting appropriate legislation, policies and action in this regard.



Key message 3

In a predominantly urban world, with over a billion in unplanned informal settlements, young women and girls are the most vulnerable. They are rarely engaged nor heard, and we fail to meet their needs when we plan and design the cities of tomorrow.



Key message 4

An intersectional gender sensitive perspective helps to understand, engage and give agency, by collecting disaggregated data to make well-informed decisions guiding urban governance, planning, design and management.

Time: December 2021 – December 2022

The 'Youth led, Nature-Culture Living Labs in India', are carried out in the Badshahpur Forest Corridor, Wazirabad channel, entry area to Gurugram, Anath Road and Ghazipur settlement. The projects are utilising local culture and knowledge as a foundation for implementing nature-based solutions. The project is a joint partnership between Sida and Swedbio, local partners and UN-Habitat. Approximately 100 stakeholders contributed to 5 sites, potentially impacting 25,000.





HER CITY THAILAND

Location: Chiang Khong District, Chiang Rai Province, Thailand

Partner: UNFPA, UN-Habitat, local community groups

Time: October 2022 - December 2022

In the Her City Thailand pilot project, UNFPA and UN-Habitat conducted neighbourhood assessments with the community in the Chiang Khong district. Adolescent girls and youth from ethnic minority and migrant groups participated in activities using the Her City Toolbox including exploratory walks and comparative analysis. The pilot is expected to be scaled to other cities in Thailand. Approximately 50 stakeholders contributed to 1 site, potentially impacting 5,000.



CITIES 4 WOMEN

Location: Dhangadhi sub-metropolitan city, Lamkichuha municipality, Birendranagar municipality, Sunwal municipality, Tansen municipality, Chandragiri municipality, Nepal

Partner: EU, USAID, UNOPS, UN-Habitat, Cities Alliance

Time: August 2024 – ongoing

The 'Cities 4 Women' project, funded by the EU and USAID and implemented by UNOPS, UN-Habitat and Cities Alliance, aims to enhance the demand for gender-responsive, climate-resilient public spaces through participatory urban planning and design. By evaluating community-prioritized open spaces based on risk and accessibility, the project focuses on co-designing these areas. Engaging a diverse range of stakeholders including children, youth, senior citizens, local leaders, and women's groups, the project emphasises inclusivity and collective ownership throughout the design process. The co-design workshops facilitate collaboration among these stakeholders, allowing them to share ideas and develop context-specific solutions that meet community needs in public open spaces. The project also aims at policy guidance at national level.

SDG 11: Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable countries

Target 11.3 Enhance inclusive and sustainable urbanization and capacity for participatory, integrated and sustainable human settlement planning and management in all countries.

Key message 5

A consolidated and global toolbox is still needed to assist urban actors in efficiently mainstreaming gender and intersectional perspectives into current sustainable urban development practice, no matter where in the world, or at what stage of the process. However, actors are constantly reinventing the wheel.



Key message 6

Practical experience shows that mainstreaming gender and intersectional perspectives is applicable worldwide. In any urban context it is the most efficient way to produce inclusive and sustainable visions, plans and designs for sustainable cities.



SDG 16: Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels

Target 16.1 Significantly reduce all forms of violence and related death rates everywhere.

Key message 7

Any urban actor involved in urban decision-making, governance, assessment, planning, design, construction or management has a role to play and can integrate gender and intersectional perspectives by using our tools to contribute to a more inclusive, prosperous and sustainable urban environment. Still, this is far from being automatic and being considered an integrated necessity.



Key message 8

The growing body of knowledge on the application of gender and intersectional perspectives in practice, shows that the method improves green areas, urban agriculture and ecosystem services, public transport and mobility, social meeting and educational places, water and sanitation, marketplaces, and safer spaces.



SDG 17: Strengthen the means of implementation and revitalize the Global Partnership for Sustainable Development

Key message 9

Cities for girls are cities for all, because they indirectly benefit a larger population than the primary target group. They are more likely to provide improved accessibility, mobility, air quality, well-being, social inclusion, conditions for economic activities, digital competence, resilient ecosystems, reduced distances and a strengthened local community. Still, most believe that a gender perspective only benefits the female population



Key message 10

Multi-level, multi-sector and multi-stakeholder cooperation is key for gender sensitive planning, design and implementation and is more likely to lead to long-term inclusive and sustainable local, regional, national and global environments and societies

HER CITY FREDRIKSDAL

Location: Fredriksdal, Helsingborg, Sweden

Partner: Helsingborg Municipality, Global Utmaning, UN-Habitat, Block by Block Foundation

Time: December 2021 – February 2022

The Her City project in Fredriksdal, Helsingborg, Sweden was a joint collaboration between Helsingborg municipality, UN-habitat, Block by Block Foundation and Global Utmaning. Fredriksdal is a low-income area compared to Helsingborg city at large and has a lower voter turnout. The Her City process was carried out within the framework of the City of Helsingborg's work with school holiday internships and young people were engaged to influence the design of Fredriksdal. The ambition was to increase security and well-being in the area. The neighbourhood is undergoing densification and the ambition was to make it a child-friendly area with accessible green spaces. 50 multi stakeholders contributed to 1 site, potentially impacting 5,000 daily lives.




The project #UrbanGirlsMovement was instrumental in developing the global Her City methodology, toolbox and digital platform. Global Utmaning and UN-Habitat co-facilitated the project with the municipality, which resulted in an outdoor living room developed together with young girls and renovation and lightening of the mall building on the main square. Plans and designs were also developed for the new library area, the bus station, and the underground station. 100 multi-stakeholders contributed to a wider regeneration approach of 4 sites, impacting 15,000 daily lives. The process, designs and the girls' solutions continue to influence actors' ways of working and are spreading in the area.




The Her City project in Flemingsberg in Sweden 'Urban Challenges' was a joint initiative together with a range of private partners such as MTR Nordic and Fabege, as well as the Huddinge municipality. The project was facilitated by the civil society organisations Impact Hub and Changers Hub and funded by the Swedish Institute. The project focuses on the area Hålsövägen located in accessible urban mobility with a specific concentration on safety in public transportation and station areas. 50 multi stakeholders contributed to 1 site, potentially impacting 5,000 daily lives.

HER CITY UKRAINE

Time: August 2024 - ongoing

Baltpart is a capacity building project, providing skills and knowledge on participatory methods for Ukrainian urban professionals. Participating teams have been trained in tools and methods for inclusive participatory planning and design, such as Her City Toolbox, and the Her City Guide has been translated to Ukrainian to make the method easier to apply in Ukrainian cities. Four projects are using Her City tools in local initiatives, focusing on identity, restoration, and regeneration. These include the House of Officers in Mykolaiv, led by the Mykolaiv Development Agency and City Council, the Drohobych Saltworks, Katernych Palace in Bobrovytsia, and Potocki Palace in Ivano-Frankivsk.



Masters students at the Bauhaus University focused on 6 public spaces in the old town of Weimar. The work consisted of applying the Her City toolbox, focusing on data collection of movement and public life measurements. 250 participants contributed to the citizen survey, and extensive advocacy work took place to sensitize both decision-makers and the wider public, potentially impacting 30,000 inhabitants.



HER CITY CHANIA

Location: Chania, Greece

Partner: Chania TUC University, Municipality of Chania, UN-Habitat and Global Utmaning

Time: July 2021 – June 2022

The Her City Chania project is a unique project where UN-Habitat and the Chania Technical University of Crete developed a course, "Planning the Smart and Virtual City" making use of the Her City methodology for the academic curriculum. The seminars taught the 9 blocks and trained undergraduate students in the use of the digital tools. They made action-oriented assessments in a variety of different parts of the city. The course engaged 40 urban planning undergraduate students with support from the municipality of Chania. They focused on 12 different public spaces in Chania, potentially impacting over 60,000 inhabitants.

HAYA JOINT PROGRAMME

Location: Jericho, Jenin, Nablus, Bethlehem, Beit Jala, Beit Sahour, Al Doha on the West Bank and Khan Younis, in Gaza, Palestine

Partner: UN Women, UNFPA, UNODC, UN-Habitat, Ministry of Local Government, Palestinian Housing Council, Municipalities of the targeted cities and Canada

Time: April 2018 – December 2024

In the Haya joint program, UN-Habitat Palestine, UN Women and partners address and contribute to preventing violence against women and girls in targeted cities in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. Local authorities and multi-stakeholders including women and girls, promoted youth leadership and proposed recommendations for a nation-wide strategy informing the world’s first ‘Public Space Policy for Local Government Units’. So far 100 participants contributed to 8 analysed and rebuilt sites, impacting over 300,000 women and 300,000 men.



UN-Habitat’s Her City project in Beirut focuses on the two neighbourhoods Mar Mikhael and Gemmayzeh. The targeted public spaces were affected by the blast in 2020 and the project aims to regenerate and upgrade the urban spaces. The main focus of the project is three public stairs: St Nicholas, Laziza and Vendome stairs. The project is led by UN-Habitat Lebanon and Catalytic action with 100 participants in 3 sites, impacting 30,000 daily lives so far.

The Canterbury Community Center and Public Space Project, an initiative of UN-Habitat, Saint James Municipal Corporation, and Sandals Foundation, is transforming Canterbury's open space into a vibrant, green, and safe community area, enhancing resilience and fostering social cohesion, recreation, and social services. During an intensive month 100 community members were engaged in workshops using the Her City toolbox, and 1 rebuilt site will impact 5,000 people.

Time: October 2021 – December 2022

UN-Habitat, partners Ocupa Tu Calle, Mano a Mano, AVINA, and donor Block by Block Foundation, co-implemented the Her City Women Builders Initiative. It has catalysed urban regeneration and promoted female financial independence in the districts of La Ensanada and Pamplona Alta. Over 140 women joined forces to improve the conditions of 4 public spaces, integrating areas for green and urban agriculture and enhancing accessibility of the neighbourhoods, impacting 30,000 inhabitants.



The purpose of **Block 0** is to setup a framework and identify a relevant scale and urban planning approach for the project.



Set-up phase

Block 1 identifies and recruits stakeholders and target groups to participate throughout the project.



Assessment phase

Block 2 city-wide public space assessment assesses the state of public space at the city scale and identifies areas in urgent need of improvement.



Block 3 provides a methodology to assess and measure the quality of a selected public space within its walking radius.



Block 4 formalises brainstorming and is particularly suitable when professionals are working together with non-professionals.



Design phase

Block 5 turns the ideas into designs for the new space using a participatory digital tool-the computer game Minecraft.



Block 6 prioritises the designs, crafts guidelines and develops recommendations in multi-stakeholder groups.



Block 7 provides the plan for the public space through a participatory process similar to a client-architect meeting.



Implementation phase

Block 8 communicates the results to the community, decision-makers, and a wider global audience, including participants' feedback.



Block 9 follows the implementation of the project during construction, provides quality assurance, finalises management plans, and guides scaling up.



Block 10 monitors, measures, evaluates and reports on the project according to identified framework
